A Life Poured Out: Remembering Rick Mathena 45 Years of Faithful Service Camp Manager • Professor • Mentor • Friend

There are people who leave their mark on a place... and then there are people whose life becomes the place.

For 45 years, Rick Mathena did not simply manage Christian Acres Camp, he lived it. His love, laughter, leadership, and faith are woven into every corner of this ministry and into the hearts of the thousands of children, families, volunteers, and churches who have passed through its gates.

Rick went home to be with the Lord on December 21, 2025, closing his eyes for a nap and opening them to the face of Jesus. While our hearts ache in his absence, our hope is anchored in the life he lived and the Savior he served.

Rick's life reflected the words of Jesus with a steady, beautiful faithfulness — loving God deeply and loving people just as sincerely. He carried responsibility without ego and leadership without show. No task was beneath him, and no moment too small. Whether he was opening Scripture, solving a problem, cleaning a cabin, or staying late with a mop after everyone else had gone, Rick met each moment with the same quiet devotion.

And if you ever worked beside him, you know it was never really about the work. Rick had a way of turning simple tasks into something more — slowing life down, making space for conversation, laughter, and presence. Those were the moments where you learned the most, even if you didn't realize it at the time. Because of that, the everyday rhythms of camp life became deeply meaningful: quick trips into town, putting together each Chronicle, early morning devotions, borrowed books, Friday pizzas, playful competitions, Sunday registrations, holiday meals, late-night talks, and all the unplanned moments in between that quietly shaped hearts of camp volunteers.

We will list a current list of Scholarship Memorial gifts in honor of Tricky Ricky in the February Chronicle.

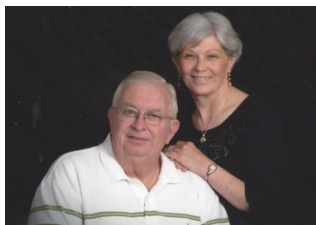
HAPPY NEW YEAR

Rick had a special way of truly seeing people. He offered patience when things were hard, wisdom when decisions felt heavy, and grace when mistakes were made. In the middle of ordinary days, his steady care made everyone feel noticed, valued, and at home. And woven through it all was his unmistakable sense of humor.

Rick believed laughter was good for the soul. Whether he was leading a room in laughter, sharing one of his classic stories, or repeating a joke you'd definitely heard before — and still hoping it might somehow be funnier this time — “Tricky Ricky” never lost his love for making people smile. He reminded us, again and again, not to take ourselves too seriously and to find joy even in the work. Beyond camp, Rick poured his life into the Kingdom as a professor at Bluefield College of Evangelism, teaching Greek, English, History, Youth Ministry, and Revelation. He shaped generations of students, preachers, and leaders, weaving truth, humor, and wisdom into every lesson. His influence stretched across churches, revivals, seminars, and classrooms throughout the East Coast. But perhaps his greatest ministry was simply how he loved. “Rick was love in motion — and he loved well.”

His love was bigger than offense. His forgiveness was constant. His care was unconditional. He did not just serve — he shepherded. He lived servant leadership before our eyes, reminding us that serving Jesus is not about recognition, but about faithfulness. At his service, a phrase was spoken that now echoes through our hearts: Live like Rick. Live with joy. Serve without being asked. Forgive quickly. Love deeply. Laugh often. Show up faithfully. Lead humbly. And never miss an opportunity to point someone to Jesus. And as we live like Rick, may our lives point where his always did — straight to Jesus. Because that is the story behind every good thing Rick ever did. Not his own strength. Not his own wisdom. But a life fully surrendered to Christ. If we follow his example of faithfulness, then the work at this camp, the ministries in our churches, and the lives of our children will continue to echo the Gospel he loved so deeply. And that is the legacy Rick would want most — not that we remember him, but that we know the Savior he served.
